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The JSE and Location Diffs

- Key concept in futures contract design is standardization of product being delivered to buyer.
- Ideal contract is thus one where there is no variation in location, quality, or timing of delivery
- Buyer only gets to know the location of his product at assignment during delivery process.
- Thus Location Differentials aim to make the buyer indifferent of the assigned location.

The Mandate
